Dear Y13 student,

Y13 Results Day - Thursday 13th August, 8am

We hope you and your family are well.

As you will be aware, the centre assessed grading process for all Year 13 pupils was completed by teachers, faculty leaders and senior staff earlier this term. This information was submitted to exam boards who are now conducting their own moderation process to finalise actual results following the guidance given to them by OfQUAL.

We have previously stated our intention to meet pupils in person on results day. This is to ensure every pupil feels supported and has access to immediate guidance in the next stage of their education. We are pleased to announce that this will take place on **Thursday 13th August, 8am**.

When you arrive at school, please make your way to the tent in front of reception. You will be able to wash your hands before entering the school building. You will then be directed to the relevant school area to collect your results.

Please ensure that you bring your subject textbooks, so we can reimburse you for any book deposits made. Please bring your bank account details so a BACS form can be completed for this. Please bring your UCAS Track number with you, so you can log into your UCAS account whilst at school if needed.

UCAS and post-6th Form support

For those of you who have applied to university through UCAS, we highly recommend you log on to your UCAS account and access the "Track" area at around 8am on results day.

UCAS Track will update at around 8am and you will see if you have been accepted for your firm or insurance choice. We recommend that you call both universities to ask them to reconsider. If you have not been accepted for either of these then you can then go through the Clearing process.

Not being accepted onto your firm or insurance choice does not mean you have achieved "bad grades". If the universities do not reconsider, you can start the Clearing process by calling other universities that you would like to apply for.

UCAS will not share your results with you, you will receive your results from your school. If you are going to use the Clearing process, I recommend starting these phone calls to

universities as soon as possible on results day. We are more than happy to help with this process in school but it is a great idea to get a head start.

If you have achieved higher grades than you expected, you could look to use the Adjustment Service through which you can swap your accepted place to another course or university.
