Dear Parents/ Carers,

I hope that you have had a safe and restful summer.

As we enter the next phase of the safe reopening of our school I am delighted to be welcoming back our new Year 13 cohort in September. Throughout these challenging circumstances, our pupils have consistently demonstrated outstanding effort and resilience during their remote learning and face-to-face lessons.

We now enter the most important period of your son/daughter's education and I would like to reassure you that much preparation has already taken place to ensure that results day 2021 will be a celebration of outstanding academic success. As part of this, I am pleased to share with you details of the first set of mock exams which will take place between the following dates: **Monday 14th September to Thursday 24th September.**

On the following page please find a two-week overview of when subject exams will take place. Please note, if pupils do not have an exam during a specific period (i.e they do not study the subject) they will be in their normal timetabled lessons. Pupils will also be provided with their own individual exam timetable.

To accelerate the progress of our pupils, these exams will be fundamental in assessing existing knowledge within every subject enabling staff to address any gaps in understanding that may have occurred during school closure. This will enable us to refine and adapt our curriculum to meet the needs of every pupil with precision. It will also be a fantastic opportunity for pupils to experience a full suite of exams in formal exam conditions.

To prepare for these exams, specific subject information will be shared with pupils during their first lessons back with their teachers. This will also include subject-specific revision strategies that will support pupils during the exams. However, revision should commence immediately using the dedicated Year 12 and 13 revision resources that are available on our school website. FAQs

1. Why are we sending this out during the summer holidays?

Due to the extended disruption, we are conducting the first round of Year 13 mock exams slightly earlier than usual. The attached schedule will provide pupils with an understanding of how the weeks will be structured and which subjects will be covered. This early notice will enable pupils to begin to prepare for these exams prior to returning in September. This may simply be pupils re-acquainting themselves with the subject content that they have covered so far in their course. Please see the link above for more information on each subject.



2. Why are we conducting the first round of Year 13 mock exams earlier than usual?

These exams will be a very important diagnostic tool for subject teachers who will then be able to assess the current working knowledge of our pupils. With such unique circumstances, where pupils have not been in school full-time for an extended period of time, the early identification of knowledge gaps will be instrumental in our ability to implement the very best curriculum for your child.

3. How will this benefit my child?

Experiencing these mock exams early in the year will enable subject leaders to provide excellent individually-tailored support for our pupils as early as possible. This will include providing detailed feedback following the exams that will enable pupils to understand their strengths and areas for improvement. Additionally, following these exams there will be an excellent support package that will provide pupils with the resources and methods for addressing any areas for improvement they may have. Over time, this early acceleration of learning will alleviate stress and anxiety across their final year of key stage 5 study and provide an excellent platform for a calm and measured exam season in 2021.

4. What types of preparation should my child do prior to their return to school?

As mentioned previously, each pupil will be provided with a full personalised exam timetable on their return to school. They will also receive subject-specific guidance detailing which elements of the subject they should dedicate their revision time to. Prior to this, pupils should be refamiliarising themselves with the course content of which they have already covered up to this point.
