<p>Suspicious – having or showing doubt of someone/something</p> <p>Essential – a thing that is absolutely necessary or extremely important</p> <p>Tolerance – to have an understanding of the behaviours and opinions of others, even if you do not agree with them</p> <p>Frequent – occurring or done many times OR to visit a place often</p> <p>Independent – capable of thinking or acting for oneself; freedom from outside control</p>	<p>Precious – something of great value that is not to be wasted or treated carelessly</p> <p>Official – relating to an authority or public body and its activities and responsibilities</p> <p>Expectant – having or showing an excited feeling that something is about to happen</p> <p>Innocence – being pure; freedom from guilt or blame</p> <p>Assistant – a person who helps to fulfil a particular purpose</p>	<p>Conscious – to be aware or have knowledge of something; a deliberate or intentional action/behaviour</p> <p>Special – better, greater, or otherwise different from what is usual</p> <p>Observance – the action of watching or noticing something</p> <p>Decent – to be appropriate and respectable</p> <p>Obedient – willing to comply with an order or request</p>	<p>Delicious – highly pleasant or delightful, particularly to taste</p> <p>Artificial – something that does not exist naturally; fake</p> <p>Hesitant – being unsure or slow in acting/speaking</p> <p>Confidence – the state of feeling certain about the truth of something</p> <p>Adorable – inspiring great affection or delight</p>	<p>Malicious – intending to cause harm</p> <p>Partial – limited or incomplete OR favouring one side in an argument OR having a liking for something</p> <p>Substantial – of considerable importance, size, or worth OR real and tangible rather than imaginary</p> <p>Confidential – intended to be kept private or secret</p> <p>Applicable – relevant or appropriate</p>	<p>Ambitious – having or showing a strong desire and determination to succeed</p> <p>Hesitation – pausing before saying or doing something; doubt or reluctance</p> <p>Decency – behaviour or appearance that is respectable and meets the required standards</p> <p>Considerably – by a notably large amount or to a notably large extent; greatly</p> <p>Changeable – something that is adjustable or inconstant</p>	<p>Cautious – being careful so as to avoid potential problems or dangers</p> <p>Fictitious – not real or true; occurring in or invented for fiction</p> <p>Expectation – a strong belief that something will happen or be the case</p> <p>Observation – the ability to notice things, especially significant details</p> <p>Tolerable – able to be endured OR fairly good/adequate</p>
